CASE for Kids **Select Services** Program matches qualified providers with CASE for Kids-supported sites to engage youth in hands-on, project-based out-of-school time activities in diverse content areas with a focus on literacy and numeracy integration, and social emotional learning (SEL) integration.

Select Services Providers are chosen by CASE for Kids for their ability to deliver quality programming. Applicants may choose to apply for one or more of the following deliverables:

- 1.) Direct Service provide project-based learning activities at multiple afterschool sites throughout the year
- 2.) Train-the-Trainer provide training to afterschool practitioners in the provider's area of expertise
- **3.) Kids' Day Project** provide a series of sequential project-based sessions or train site staff to deliver sessions at afterschool sites, and provide an off-site culminating event that supports lessons learned during sessions

APPLICANT ELIGIBILITY

- Currently approved, or pending approval, as a <u>CASE for Kids Afterschool and Summer Direct Service</u>
 Provider or CASE for Kids Trainer or Consultant.
- Two (2) years' experience within the last five (5) years in providing similar services proposed in this application
- Willingness to deliver service to sites in targeted geographic areas (see below)
- Capacity to meet administrative requirements outlined in this application
- Capacity to meet deliverable requirements outlined in this application

REQUIRED ORGANIZATIONAL CAPACITY

Select Services Providers must have the organizational capacity to:

- Operate on a reimbursement model with the ability to deliver services 30 days in advance of payment for services
- Coordinate schedules, place instructors, and maintain ongoing effective communication with the program site
- Provide direct service in at least two geographic areas in Harris County, TX
- Provide necessary materials and equipment to deliver program content
- Provide experienced staff with content expertise to engage children, youth and staff and effectively deliver high quality, age-appropriate, project-based activities
- Collect and electronically submit accurate and timely information that includes site schedules, staff background checks, staff resumes, and attendance reports as required
- Adherence to CASE for Kids Select Services guidelines and requirements
- Meet CASE for Kids training requirements:
 - Staff participation in 10 hours of CASE for Kids trainings or provide proof of comparable training prior to August 31, 2018
- Monthly attendance by at least one staff member at Select Services Learning Communities at CASE for Kids, January 2018 through May 2018
- Participate in CASE for Kids surveys and focus groups

DELIVERABLES

Based on the ability to meet program requirements, applicants may choose to apply for more than one deliverable. Read below each deliverable description for program requirements.

DELIVERABLE 1: DIRECT SERVICE

Select Services Providers will offer quality, age appropriate, project-based hands-on learning activities for children and youth during out-of-school time at selected CASE for Kids-supported sites.

Program Requirements

- Provide session content based on services outlined in the CASE for Kids Afterschool and Summer Direct Service Provider RFP
- Maintain a supportive environment designed to engage children and youth in collaborative learning and skill acquisition with a focus on literacy or numeracy integration, and SEL integration
- Deliver direct services between January 5, 2018 and August 31, 2018
- Provide a minimum of four (4) sessions (at least 45 minutes in length) per site
- Provide sequential sessions for programming that takes place during the school year
- Deliver sessions at multiple sites approved by CASE for Kids
- Provide CASE for Kids with a detailed site schedule one week prior to service delivery (Site schedule template provided by CASE for Kids)

Commitment to Continuous Quality Improvement

CASE for Kids is committed to promoting high quality programming within the Houston area out-of-school time field through our <u>Quality Framework</u>. All Select Services Providers will be expected to work toward continuous quality improvement. Select Services must be prepared to collect and submit quantitative data below in support of their program's evaluation:

- Youth enrollment & attendance by individual participant, using CASE for Kids attendance system
- Activity schedule at each site
- Youth and practitioner participant assessments and results

To inform continuous quality improvement of the provider's programming, CASE for Kids will provide the programmatic feedback:

- External site assessment scores
- Results of satisfaction surveys administered to practitioners and youth
- Review meeting with CASE for Kids at the end the contract term

Any programmatic feedback shared is low-stakes and is intended to assist providers in enhancing program quality and will not affect provider's future involvement with CASE for Kids.

Funding

All CASE for Kids Select Services Providers will receive a seven (7) month contract to deliver services at selected CASE for Kids-supported sites. **Contract minimum is \$8,000** to serve approximately 4-8 sites and includes \$500 for project administration. Providers must complete the vendor renewal process as required by HCDE Purchasing and remain in good standing as an HCDE vendor for the length of the contract. Funding for Select Services contracts is contingent upon approval by the Gulf Coast Workforce Development Board, Texas Workforce Commission, HCDE Board of Trustees and is subject to EDGAR regulations.

DELIVERABLE 2: TRAIN-the-TRAINER

Select Services Providers with content expertise will offer a train-the-trainer model for afterschool practitioners to utilize at their program sites.

Program Requirements

- Provide session content based on services outlined in the CASE for Kids Trainers and Consultants
 RFP or HCDE General Consultant Services RFP.
- Provide instructional and subject matter experts to successfully deliver the Select Services Trainthe-Trainer session(s)
- Provide hands-on workshop materials to teach out-of-school time practitioners how to deliver subject matter content
- Provide take-away materials for up to 15 students for participants to deliver engaging, projectbased, academically enriching activities to students at their program site
- Intentionally integrate literacy and/or numeracy concepts into subject matter topic
- Intentionally integrate SEL. For more information on social emotional learning, SEL, refer to the CASEL website
- Provide documentation of trainer's expertise in the session content and ability to train others
- Session length is proposed by the trainer based on content

Commitment to Continuous Quality Improvement

CASE for Kids is dedicated to ensuring high quality out-of-school time programming in Harris County, TX. All Select Services Providers will be expected to work toward continuous quality improvement. Select Services Providers must be prepared to collect and submit the following data in support of their program's evaluation in order to measure progress:

- Session attendance by individual participant
- Session participant satisfaction survey

To inform continuous quality improvement of the providers programming, CASE for Kids will provide results of satisfaction surveys administered to practitioners.

<u>Funding</u>

CASE for Kids Select Services Providers will receive a contract from CASE for Kids to deliver trainings and take-away materials for practitioners based on the provider's content expertise that includes literacy and/or numeracy and social learning concepts. Contract period and contract amount will be determined on a case by case basis. Funding for Select Services contracts is contingent upon approval by the Gulf Coast Workforce Development Board, Texas Workforce Commission, HCDE Board of Trustees and is subject to EDGAR regulation.



DELIVERABLE 3: Select Services Provider Kids' Day Project

Select Services Providers deliver a series of sequential project-based sessions or train site staff to deliver sessions at 10 afterschool program sites, and provide an off-site culminating event that supports lessons learned during Kids' Day Project sessions.

Case for Kids Kids' Day Project model is a fun and educational project that connects after-school students with real world issues. Students participating in a Kids' Day Project meet in their after-school programs for approximately 8 weeks to work through prepared project-based learning curricula related to math, science, technology and/or the arts. Students from participating Kids' Day sites then come together for a culminating event that gives them the opportunity to interact with each other and celebrate what they learned in their Kids' Day Project classes.

Program Requirements

- Provide activity plan and lesson plans for all sessions.
- Deliver direct services to sites OR deliver training for site staff to deliver lessons for a minimum of eight (8) sequential sessions (at least 45 minutes in length) at 10 afterschool program sites designated by CASE for Kids between January 8, 2018 and May 25, 2018.
- Produce and coordinate an off-site culminating event no later than May 25, 2018.
- Provide lunch and beverages for students and chaperones at the culminating event.
- Provide all students materials for sessions and the culminating event.
- Provide session content based on services outlined in the CASE for Kids Afterschool and Summer Direct Service Provider RFP, CASE for Kids Trainers and Consultants RFP, or the HCDE General Consultant Services RFP.
- Provide session content that is designed to engage students in a supportive environment with a focus literacy or numeracy integration, and SEL integration.

<u>CASE for Kids will provide the following support to the provider for the Kids' Day Project culminating event:</u> student registration for all sites, coordination and payment of students' transportation, logistic support, press release, photography, and a free Kids' Day Project T-shirt for each student.

Commitment to Continuous Quality Improvement

CASE for Kids is committed to promoting high quality programming within the Houston area out of school time field through our <u>Quality Framework</u>. All Select Services Providers will be expected to work toward continuous quality improvement. Select Services must be prepared to collect and submit quantitative data below in support of their program's evaluation:

- Youth enrollment & attendance for sessions by individual participant, using CASE for Kids attendance system, if the Select Services provider is offering the direct service model.
- Youth and practitioner participant assessments and results

To inform continuous quality improvement of the provider's programming, CASE for Kids will provide the programmatic feedback:

- Results of satisfaction surveys administered to practitioners and youth
- Review meeting with CASE for Kids at the end the contract term

Any programmatic feedback shared is low-stakes and is intended to assist providers in enhancing program quality and will not affect provider's future involvement with CASE for Kids.

Funding

All CASE for Kids Select Services Providers will receive seven (7) month contract to support the Kids' Day Project at 10 designated CASE for Kids-supported sites. The contract minimum for the Kids' Day Project is \$20,000. Allowable expenses covered in the contract include: direct service or staff training, all supplies and materials for sequential sessions at 10 sites, project administration, event coordination, event rental space, event food for chaperones and students, and event materials and supplies for students. Providers must complete the vendor renewal process as required by HCDE Purchasing and remain in good standing as an HCDE vendor for the length of the contract. Funding for Select Services contracts is contingent upon approval by the Gulf Coast Workforce Development Board, Texas Workforce Commission, HCDE Board of Trustees and is subject to EDGAR regulations.

APPLICATION REVIEW AND SELECTION PROCESS

CASE for Kids will first review all applications submitted for completion and compliance with the minimum administrative requirements. Completed applications that meet the administrative requirements will then be reviewed for overall program requirements. CASE for Kids will take into consideration the variety of services submitted by all applicants for targeted geographic service areas as well as the history of the applicant with CASE for Kids. The review committee reserves the right to interview any or all applicants during the review process. Upon completion of application review, CASE for Kids will notify applicants chosen for the Select Services Program in writing.
