Cultural diversity in U.S. public schools is growing. These demographic trends present new challenges for schools and out-of-school time (OST) programs. In this workshop, participants learn that Culturally Responsive Classroom Management (CRCM) is an approach to running programs with all children in a culturally responsive way, not simply for racial/ethnic minority children. More than a set of strategies or practices, CRCM is a pedagogical approach that guides the management decisions that OST professionals make. It is a natural extension of culturally responsive teaching in daily lessons which uses students' backgrounds, rendering of social experiences, prior knowledge, and learning styles.
