- During the simulation, you experience a day in the life of an individual receiving or accessing services using Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits. You also apply for a job using public transportation.
- The poverty simulation experience is designed to view poverty from different angles, to sensitize those who frequently deal with low-income families and to create a broader awareness among community leaders.
- At the end of the simulation, our discussion allows for reflection on the experience in order to gain further understanding and insights.
